***Minutes of TEBA Executive Committee Meeting
August 15, 2019
Cobbtown Baptist Church***

The meeting was called to order by Rev. Curt Tootle, Vice Moderator. Rev. Raymond Trent of Cobbtown Baptist Church welcomed the Executive Committee and opened with prayer.

After review of the minutes of the May 16, 2019 meeting, a motion and second were made to approve; minutes were unanimously approved without objection. Bro. Curt asked for a review of the financial report; a motion and second were made; financial statement was unanimously approved as printed without discussion.

Standing Committee Reports:

Discipleship Ministries – Bro. Freddy reminded everyone of the GoGeorgia Conference being held August 23-24 in Statesboro and encouraged church members and leaders to participate.

Men's Ministries – Steve West provided a report on several ministry projects that have taken place in the areas surrounding the association. Men's ministry has a project to build a ramp for an elderly lady on Saturday from 8 – 4 near Glennville. Any and all men are invited to participate and help with this project. Steve also reported that fishing expedition is in the planning stages for the men in the association in order to gather for some fun and fellowship, more details to come.

Women's Ministries – Sandra Powell provided the report of WMU activities including the Christmas in August Focus projects. She requested updates from all churches WMU's on projects that have been done in individual churches. She stated that there has been a focus on helping out at Promise of Hope, Backpack Buddies, etc. The next team meeting is scheduled for October 1 at Connor's. November 4 will be the World Day of Prayer, and December 1-7 is the Week of Prayer for International Missions and emphasis on Lottie Moon Christmas Offering.

biggest outreach in churches. She shared a few statistics from the book: 2.5 million people attended VBS. Over 155,000 unchurched families connected with the body of Christ. Over 70,000 people made professions of faith. Over 1,300 kids responded to God's call into ministry or missions. In a single week, kids receive 15 hours of intense discipleship, which is equivalent to 7 months of ministry. \$6.5 million given to mission causes through VBS offerings. In 1997 81% of churches offered VBS, by 2012 that dropped to 68%. VBS – It's Worth It!

ASSOCIATIONAL MISSIONARY REPORT

Bro. Freddy Gardner reiterated the importance of VBS. The greatest reaching of young people is during VBS. If we aren't concentrating on reaching the young people in our community our churches are going to die. We need to have our best workers in youth and children. The most impressionable age is under the age of 18. Statistically if a person is not reached for Christ by the age of 18 the potential for reaching them drops dramatically.

STRATEGY PLANNING: Brother Freddy asked for continued prayer for the strategy team; Pastors will be receiving survey forms that need to be completed. Ricky Thrasher and Marty Youngblood will be meeting with each pastor at scheduled appointment times on September 16 and September 17 to collect the surveys and obtain more information.

MISSIONS:

Ducktown Mission Trip: This trip will be held September 8-13. The group will depart Sunday afternoon from Collins First at 2:00 p.m. and be ready to work on Monday morning at Copper Basin Crisis Center and surrounding area. Cost for the trip is \$125 per person which includes food, lodging and transportation as well as mission projects while in the area.

Christmas Backpacks: Information will be available on <http://tebaonline.org> in the next few weeks for the Backpack Ministry at Copper Basin Crisis Center. TEBA will be ordering backpacks to be used for less than \$4 each for any churches that would like to participate. This year's distribution and Happy Birthday Jesus Celebration will take place December 14. The group will leave on Friday, December 13, and return after the distribution party on December 14. This trip has been fully funded by a benefactor and therefore costs the TEBA nothing including hotel rooms for Friday night. Bro. Freddy related that in the TEBA backpacks, we are asking for more non-perishable food items than what the State has asked for. This is a great ministry which provides Christmas for children who would otherwise receive nothing.

Haiti 2019: Continue to pray for Haiti. The mission trip in July was very successful with no issues to speak of concerning the unrest in Haiti. The decision has been made to return to Haiti

December 18-22 for a medical mission. Be in prayer for Bro. Freddy Gardner, Lynn Gardner, Wendy West, and Steve West as they travel to minister to the people of Haiti. The group is looking forward to a great trip with lots of mission activity to provide many services that are greatly needed. Looking forward to next summer the plan is to add 2 new churches to the mission trip which will increase the number of children to be reached by between 350 – 500. That being said there will be a need for additional workers next year. The trip is planned again for the second week in July.

Annual Meeting: Will be held at Agape in Claxton on October 17, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. Keynote speaker will be Dennis Rivera, GBMB Intercultural Church Planting and Mission Ministry Missionary. Dennis has helped TEBA in many ways and is a true friend to our association.

Dental Van: Dental van for 2020 will be April 13 – 18 at Emmanuel, Glennville. More details will be sent out as we get closer to this event.

Bro. Freddy introduced Jean Eldon Bozar, as he came to lead in a time of musical worship.

Devotional: Rev. Raymond Trent spoke of how wonderful it is to see God's work happening around us. God walks with us and there is no reason to be nervous or fearful as God is always there with us. He then asked for words for God – Mighty, Hope, Glorious, Awesome. We serve an awesome God. Think about it He spoke everything into existence, and something out of nothing. Nobody else has ever been or ever will be able to do that. God's word is being revealed and will never change. God has a reason for everything, and everything is in His control. Just as with salvation, we have a choice. Daily we have a choice when we wake up each morning, we can either wake up humdrum, not excited because it's "just another day" or we can wake up joyful because God gave us another day. We should always be joyful knowing that God's got our back. God always leads the way. See John 3:16; John 1:11-12; John 10:10. Always remember it's not about "me," it's all about God! Eternity doesn't hinge upon my performance. God's glory doesn't depend on me, we are to be used by God. He is the potter and we are the clay. The clay never tells the potter what to make from it, the potter chooses what type of potter to make. Think of the hymn "Trust and Obey," do we honor those words? When we don't obey, He is always there to pick up the pieces when we are broken. He will never leave us or forsake us. We are never alone. There is no one like God, His promises can be taken to the bank. Nothing will separate us from His love. God is compassionate – He brings peace in troubled circumstances. BE OBEDIENT. All God wants is simple obedience. God calls us not to be successful, only to be faithful, he will do the rest. Be obedient and faithful.

Wrap-Up: Rev. Curt Tootle reviewed the upcoming calendar of events provided in the meeting program. Prayer slips were passed around for everyone to pray for churches in the TEBA.

Bro. Curt closed the meeting with prayer; the meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

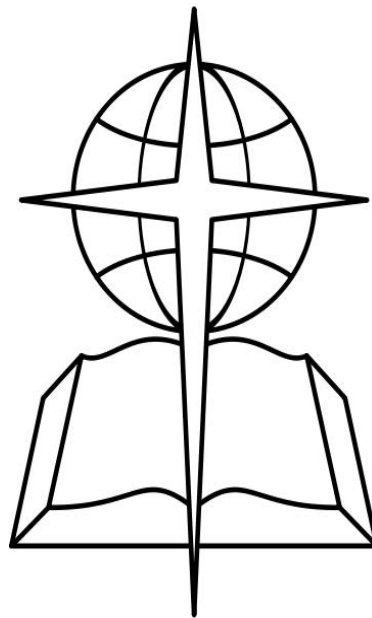

2019 Association Missionary Report

Wow! What a year to have been alive and serving the Lord.

Tattnall-Evans Baptist has spent the last year doing missions, ministry and planning for the future. Our various ministry leaders have done an exceptional job in keeping ministry and missions before us and in practice.

Something that has been happening this year is Strategy Planning for the Association. A group of some 15 Pastors and Lay Leaders have been meeting discussing and dreaming of what we will look like in the future. That team, tonight, submits for your approval a purpose statement for the Association. This statement reads: "Tattnall-Evans Baptist Association exists to unify and strengthen churches by supporting them through prayer and the Word of God in order to fulfill the Great Commission". In addition we propose a tag phrase of: "Strength through unity in Christ". We also propose as our four core beliefs: 1. The Bible: We value the Bible as the inerrant divinely inspired revelation of God to man. 2. The Great Commission: We value the Great Commission as the direct charge of Jesus Christ for His church to share the Gospel with the lost and make disciples through His Word. 3. Unity: We value unity under the lordship of Christ, believing that we can accomplish more for His kingdom together. 4. Prayer: We value prayer as the first work of the association, believing that God's work cannot be accomplished without it.

This past year the Association has participated in numerous missions' activities including the Wildlife Festival Baby Comfort Station, The Mobile Dental Health Unit, and four wheelchair ramps and/or porches headed by the Men's Ministry. In September we completed our annual trip to Copper Basin Crisis Center in Ducktown TN. 17 people representing six churches participated in the trip. Last December approximately 75 people participated in the Backpack Christmas Give-a-way and Party at Copper Basin. The Association gave 675 Backpacks to this ministry last year. In addition in the fall of last year a team worked in and around Bainbridge, Ga in hurricane clean-up and recovery. A group of 12 from seven churches were on the trip. We completed a trip to Haiti in July for VBS and Medical Missions.

Up-coming Mission trips include: Dec. 13-14 Backpack Christmas Party in Ducktown, Dec. 19-22 a small team to Haiti for Medical Missions, Dec. 27 and return Jan. 3 to Bahamas (Cost is \$500), Haiti Mission Trip July 3-11 (cost is \$1,500) There is a need for a larger group to go this year due to ministry at another church; Sept. 13-18 Copper Basin Mission Trip. In addition the annual Baby Changing Station will be manned during the Wildlife Festival. Also, our Men's Ministry has a project planned for Nov. 2 at Promise of Hope. (See calendar in this book of reports). The Dental Van will be at Emmanuel on Apr. 14-18 for Dental only. There will also be opportunities for cleanings this year.

The annual Choir-fest will be this Sunday evening (Oct 20) at 6:00 at Rehoboth. The annual event is always well attended and a night of great worship together.

Our Association Youth committee hosted the first annual Disciple-Now in January which was a great weekend for students to worship together and be challenged in Lordship. The next D-Now will be Feb. 28-Mar. 1 this year. Friday and Saturday evening joint services will be held at Elza.

Sugar-time was very successful this last year. I encourage all of our churches to be involved with this ministry to aid Georgia Baptist Children's Home in Baxley. Let me remind us that the Children's Homes receive no monies from the Cooperative Program.

Now, I need to encourage us to be vigilant about our primary purpose: proclaiming Jesus Christ to our Community, State, Nation and World. There are 36,800 people who live in Tattnall and Evans Counties. Our Churches (using the information you submitted on the Annual Church Profile) have a Sunday worship attendance of just over 2,500. Folks we're not even reaching 10 percent of the population. Our church attendance has decreased over the last 10 years, and our baptisms are down. Yet, there are some positives Sunday School attendance and enrollment is up slightly. Missions' participation has greatly increased.

With the above information and other information obtained continue to pray for the strategy team as we work to focus the Association to best help our churches.

Together we can accomplish more. "Strength through Unity in Christ."

2019 Women's Ministry Report

The TEBA Women's Ministry has had a fantastic 2019 being the hands and feet of Jesus. The first Team Meeting was held on Tuesday, January 8 at Collins First Baptist Church at 7:00 p.m.

On Thursday, February 7 at 6:45 p.m., Elza Baptist church hosted the Inspirational Banquet. The social hall was decorated beautifully by the Elza WMU ladies. Our speaker was Stephanie Carr, Director of the Savannah Baptist Center. Lynn Gardner, Southeastern WMU Mobilizer, shared what WMU is to all our churches and communities.
